New Minister Announced

Mrs. Krista Rasco of San Antonio, Tex., has been extended a call to be pastor of FPC-Commerce, pending confirmation of the call by Grace Presbytery at the next Presbytery meeting Feb. 28-Mar. 1. Pastor Rasco came to our church on Sunday, Jan. 19, to conduct the morning worship service.

Following the service, a congregational meeting was held and there was a unanimous vote from the members who were present to accept the recommendation of the Pastor Nominating Committee. At the covered-dish luncheon following the congregational meeting, Pastor Rasco and her family were warmly welcomed by all.

Mrs. Rasco grew up in Missouri and in Boerne and Bandera, Tex. She earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Austin College in Sherman in 2006 and a Master of Divinity Degree from Union Presbyterian Seminary in Virginia in 2011. She is married to Jason Rasco. They have a two-year-old daughter Kaitlynn. She also has two step children who live in Austin. Elizabeth, who will be 15 in March, and Julian, who is 12, live with their mother and will only be able to visit sporadically because of school functions.

While this will be her first pastoral position, the PNC was in agreement that her energy, enthusiasm and personality will enable her to successfully lead our congregation. They were impressed with her determination to become a minister, her obvious spirituality, her sincere interest in people and her desire to serve a small congregation. In addition, the PNC pointed out that she grew up in a small town and has served as a student pastor of campus ministry at Davidson College in North Carolina.

Pastor Rasco and her family plan to live in Commerce. After confirmation of her call by Grace Presbytery, she will start as minister on Monday, Mar. 10.

We extend our gratitude and thanks to the PNC who have worked diligently more than a year and a half to find a pastor for our congregation. Members of the PNC are Dr. Keith McFarland and Helon Razniak, Co-chairs; Martha Clevenger, Walter Sanders, Neal Stewart and Dennis White.

Meals On Wheels Reorganizes

In May of 2013, the Commerce Meals On Wheels Board of Directors met with the SCRPT people in Greenville and started the process of transferring our clients over to the SCRPT program. The reason for this change was the ever increasing cost of food and labor plus rent on the Linda Muller Community center.

The Commerce Meals on Wheels purchased meals from SCRPT (and our drivers delivered them) three days a week through Dec. 17th when the program officially ended.

SCRPT provides seven meals per week: five hot meals Monday through Friday plus two frozen meals delivered also on Friday for the weekend. To contact the Hunt County SCRPT program, call 903/454-1444 ext. #6.

The Meals on Wheels program operated in Commerce from 1976 until 2013. I was a member of the Board of directors 30 of those years.

Commerce Food Pantry Growing

The "Pantry" is busy. Every Thursday afternoon from 2-4 p.m. in the North wing of the First Presbyterian Church anywhere from 40 to 50 heads of families arrive to collect a supplemental amount of canned/dry food from our stores.

This past summer and through the year-end holidays the generous giving of food and money has kept the Pantry's shelves full and ready for each week's attempt to feed the less fortunate in Commerce and the surrounding cities (Campbell, Cumby, Fairlie and Celeste and a few points in between). A simple request for food assistance from a person is all that is needed to start the "Pantry" process of receiving food. Afterwards, a screening process is started to document their address, number and age of the household residents along with their relationships (spouse, sibling, parent, etc.) This form will later be referred to in determining the amount of food assistance they will receive each month.

The attendance to the Pantry is slowly growing. We are seriously looking for larger facilities to house our record keeping forms, screening/interview room, food storage including shelving and the food distribution room. Plus, we need room for a couple of refrigerators to store perishable goods. On Tuesday, Jan. 21, I went before the Commerce City Council and made an "announcement" that I would like the City to provide a city owned/controlled building to house the Commerce Food Pantry. The request was well received and will be placed on the Council Agenda for the next meeting scheduled on Feb. 18 for further discussion. Quick reviews of available city owned buildings do not look good, but we are still looking and will not give up easily! The volunteers at the Pantry are fantastic! Have I used up all my exclamation marks yet? Anyway, it takes a lot of people to load and unload the food each week on Wednesday mornings, mark each item, and stock the shelves. Then we get to give the food away each Thursday.

Mark your calendars now and prepare your hearts. Ash Wednesday, March 5, marks the beginning of Lent
