Sunday, April 6, was a great day in the history of FPC. A special service was held at 4 p.m. celebrating the ordination of Krista Welch Rasco to the ministry of word and sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) and her installation as FPC's newest pastor.

The event gave FPC a full-time pastor for the first time in over a year and was attended by not only the congregation, but a host of Presbyterian pastors and elders from near and afar to help with the service and usher Rev. Rasco into her first pastoral position in the Presbyterian Church. Rev. Rasco's milestones were witnessed by numerous family members as well.

Following the service, a reception for Rev. Rasco was held.

### **Presbyterian Women News**

<u>Circle Meeting</u> – The next Circle Meeting will be held on Monday, May 12, at 10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Bible Study leader is Nila McQuary and hostess is Toni Deaton. In addition to leading the Bible lesson, Nila will present information regarding the annual **Birthday Offering** which will be taken at the meeting. All women are invited to attend.

<u>Birthday Offering – History of the Offering</u>: In 1922 to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the Woman's Auxiliary (PCUS), it was decided that an offering should be made for a definite cause. That year, Hallie Paxson Winsborough, superintendent of women's work, visited Miss Dowd's School for Girls in Kochi, Japan. She challenged members of the Woman's Auxiliary to give one penny for each year of their lives (or a dollar if a woman preferred not to reveal her age) as a birthday gift to the school. The tradition continued when the Woman's Auxiliary became Women of the Church in 1948, and then Presbyterian Women in 1988. The offerings have enabled a long succession of new and innovative mission projects throughout the world.

While projects and donation amounts have changed, the commitment of Presbyterian Women to improving the lives of others has not. The Creative Ministries Offering Committee of Presbyterian Women annually reviews proposals and selects up to five projects to fund through the gifts to the Birthday Offering. For the 2014 Offering, one project will be funded, so the grant will be larger and make more of an impact.

The actual grant amount awarded to Blue Corn Mothers Alliance will depend on gifts offered during 2014. The goal for the 2014 Birthday Offering is \$500,000.

**Blue Corn Mothers Alliance** – The Blue Corn Mothers Advocacy Center in Albuquerque, New Mexico, is the chosen project for 2014. Blue Corn Mothers Alliance provides a range of services for Albuquerque's Native American women who experience domestic violence. This multifaceted program offers advocacy; crisis intervention, health counseling and education services, and referrals to legal and shelter services to Native American women and children who have suffered domestic violence.

This program is the only one in the Albuquerque area that offers domestic violence counseling with a focus on Native American cultural sensitivity. Research shows that Native American women are more likely to experience domestic and sexual violence than non-Native women. More than one in three Native American women will experience sexual violence in their lives, and 39 percent of Native American women experience domestic violence in some form.

Through the Birthday Offering gift, this once-a-week program, currently run by volunteers out of La Mesa Presbyterian Church, will be available five days a week with staff. The money received will be leveraged and allow them to compete for funding locally from the City of Albuquerque and nationally from the Department of Justice and the Administration for Children and Families. Blue Corn Alliance hopes that these additional funding sources can be secured to help open a shelter.

In May of 2013, our PW circle contributed \$165 to last year's Birthday Offering. If you would like to donate to the 2014 project, you may do so by giving your check to Irene Humfeld, treasurer, or to Toni Deaton, moderator. Checks should be made out to Presbyterian Women and "Birthday Offering" should be written in the reference line on the check.

**Special Event on June 14** – On Saturday, June 14 at Noon, the PW Circle will host a covered-dish luncheon in honor of our Commerce High School graduate, Kiley Towne. All women are invited to attend and guests are welcome. Please mark this special date on your calendar!

## I CAN Help (Did they ever!)



"The canned Food drive is a tangible way for our children to learn about caring for others," wrote Miller, adding that "The Food Pantry helps many families in Commerce each week.

Some of those families might even have children who attend Commerce Elementary School.

Parents were asked to send donations of food to their child's classroom. A pizza party was promised to the classroom that contributed the most food.

To schedule a mammography screening, call 903-408-5010.. A low \$100 fee, which may be covered by your insurance company, will be charged. If you don't have insurance or can't afford a fee, there is an option for assistance. Call 903-408-5730 and ask for Judy Quan.

Mammography screening is available to women over 40 who have not had one in the past year.

To register for a PVD screening, which measures blood flow in the lower extremities, call 903-408-1688. This screening is free.


In addition, Atmos Energy will serve hotdogs, chips and a drink, with donations accepted to help Commerce's youth sports program.
