He worked with several congregations in east Texas. He began as the Director of the Sabine Valley Larger Parish and Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Gladewater, Texas. He later served the Grace Presbyterian Church in Greenville and the First Presbyterian Church in Athens.

He also served in a number of capacities for Grace Presbytery, including Synod of the Sun commissioner from GP, member of the Division of Care for Church Professionals, Court Functions and Moderator of the Worship Committee for Grace Presbytery. He also served as a member of the Committee on Ministry and as a commissioner to the General Assembly in Kansas City.

He leaves behind a wife, two children, and two grandchildren.
