Dear First Presbyterian Church,

More PW News

Back on Aug. 9 some of FPC's women visited the Bradley House, a Presbyterian Children's Home, as part of a trip for a Grace Presbytery PW Coordinating Team Meeting. Here is a description of that visit.

The Children's Home has several buildings spread over a large expanse of acreage. There was a pretty little church built of stone, a swimming pool, playground, soccer field, and a meeting hall. There are three or four large, modern ranch style houses with front porches, plants, and outdoor chairs for the children.

We toured one home which had a backyard with a fenced in area for a dog, barbecue grills, and a porch with a picnic table. Inside was a large family room with a dining area and a kitchen. Four bedrooms surrounded that living area. On one side was a laundry, on another was a study with two computers. We saw two large-screen televisions and a closet full of board games. A nice young man who lives there gave the tour.

A gentleman discussed the Homes in Itasca and Waxahachie as well as other services that Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS) offers. He mentioned that 25 of their high school graduates are in college at this time. One just graduated from Austin College, others are at junior colleges, and a couple are at the University of Texas. PCHAS tries to follow and help each kid even after they turn 18 to make sure that they are successful as young adults. The young man who gave us a tour said that his friend at the Home had recently graduated, found a job, and moved into an apartment this summer.

The visit was very enlightening, and it was good to know that our Presbyterian Women provide ongoing support to PCHAS programs.
