

# **A Message From the Pastor**

Halloween has always been one of my favorite holidays. There are so many traditions around it and I want to share with you all a few. When I lived in Scotland I was able witness the celebrations around Samhain (pronounced sa-win), which is a Gaelic festival.



It marks the end of one season or time period (originally the end of harvest) and the beginning of another. Samhain (like Beltane) was also seen as a liminal time when the spirits fairies could more easily come into our world or a time that the veil between the world of the living and the world of the spirits was thin allowing them to easily pass over.

On the night of Oct. 31<sup>st</sup>, there is a big parade down the streets of Edinburgh and they traveled up to a high point in the city. There are witches and goblins, among a lot of other "characters". It is thought that winter and death battle summer and life and winter/death wins. Then when Beltane comes a long (I believe it is May 1<sup>st</sup>) they come back and battle again and summer/life wins on that day.

I'm not going to go into all the different customs and histories but I did want to share with you the Christian version of celebrating this time. We have All Saints Day, traditionally celebrated on November 1<sup>st</sup>, in which we pay tribute and honor to those who were members of our church who passed away the year before.

My favorite custom, is the one in Mexico where they celebrate the Day of the Dead or Día de los Muertos.
