A Message From the Pastor

Advent marks the beginning of the new church year and begins four Sundays prior to Christmas Day (November 30th this year). During the Advent season, the church prepares for the coming Christ. Even as we make ready for the baby to be born in Bethlehem, the themes and texts



explored during Advent take us beyond the birth, and even beyond the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, to a new moment of expectancy as the Day of Christ approaches and the reign of God is made fully manifest.

At Advent, God's people summon the courage and spiritual strength to remember that the holy breaks into the daily. In tiny ways, we can open our broken hearts to the healing grace of God, who opens the way to peace. Advent is not a season for passive waiting and watching. It is a season of wailing and weeping, of opening up our lives and our souls with active anticipation and renewed hope.

But we can become distracted about what the days leading up to Christmas can mean, with the busy-ness of cleaning, cooking, enjoying parties, and shopping for the perfect gift for our loved ones. There's nothing wrong with wanting to buy the latest gadgets or

to make progress on that wish list.

But somehow Christmas Eve is here before we know it and we wonder why we don't feel renewed after this joyous season.

We're inviting you to enter this season of Advent with intention and awareness. As we prepare, watch and wait for that wonderful something God is sending our way not just at Christmas, but every single day.

Christmas CDs Help PW Help Others—Our Presbyterian Women are making Christmas CD's available to support the Birthday Offering and Living Waters of the World (LWW). LWW trains and equips volunteer teams to provide clean water in needy areas throughout the developing world and the Birthday Offering supports up to five different projects each year that meet a critical need for persons who are truly hurting or disadvantaged.

Either of two different CDs which feature familiar Christmas songs and carols (vocal and instrumental) are available for a \$15 voluntary donation. Last year more than \$100,000 was raised. The music has been arranged and performed specifically for the Presbyterian project.

Last year's recording, "Legacy Christmas— Treasured Carols of the Kirk," will again be available as will a new CD entitled "Legacy Christmas—Nativity Carols and Hymns."

This is an opportunity to support God's work and at the same time enhancing your holiday listening pleasure.




New Beginnings Update

The Glory to God hymnal of congregational song includes:

- Over 800 hymns, psalms, and spiritual songs.
 - Approximately 50% of included hymns are from the 1990 Presbyterian hymnal. The remaining pieces come from former Presbyterian hymnals, other denominational songbooks, and
- individual authors and composers.
 A musical setting of almost every Sunday lectionary psalm.
- Music from six different continents.
- Music covering all major historical and contemporary sacred genres, including approximately thirty-five African American/ Gospel hymns.
- Comprehensive indexes.

Glory to God also contains worship aids and printed liturgies for Sunday services (including baptism and the Lord's Supper) and services for daily prayer. Complete orders of service will include congregational responses, prayers, and creeds. These will be perfect resources for "green" congregations, camps and conference centers, daily prayer services, and time-pressed pastors.


