Dear family and friends of FPCC,

I have recently returned from the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s national bi-annual meeting, called General Assembly. This year it was in St. Louis, MO, and had over 2,300 participants. I served as one of the ten elected commissioners for Grace Presbytery.



This past week 538 commissioners, and

about 200 advisory delegates met to discern and seek the will of Jesus for the church and for the world in this moment in time. To do so, we hoped to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit through worship, prayer, Bible study, singing, meeting in committees and all together in plenary to discuss and perfect motions that could either direct or guide the church in word or in deed through ways such as making public statements, amending our Book of Order and Confessions, divesting, or staying at the table, and a lot of other ways.

There were quite a few issues before us, which I will delve into at a later date. Although one of my favorite parts of attending General Assembly is the profound fellowship that takes place, there is also a great amount of work that the commissioners and attendee's take quite seriously.

Fourth of July Celebration Is Sunday Night





In fact, out of the eight days we were there, we were in meetings for a little over 61 hours. We would start somewhere between 8:30/9:30 a.m. and meet until 10:30 p.m. and on the last night the meeting lasted until midnight. We would usually get about a 2-hour lunch and dinner break. Needless to say, I was exhausted when I returned (I'm not sure I've quite recovered yet).

In the midst of all that,I ended up diagnosed with strep throat. I had to stay in bed for two days but as soon as I wasn't contagious anymore I was back in the meetings. There are so many wonderful, and difficult things that happened. Now that General Assembly is over the discernments made will be taken back to Presbyteries and home churches in hopes that we all will continue to do the hard, difficult, wonderful task of discerning the will of God for our church in this time and this place, and to use that discernment to take action and witness to God's 'kindom' come.

I look forward to sharing with you all the experiences that I had last week, and having conversations about how we might continue the work of the church in this world.
