SCAMP 2016 is here for its second summer run starting Monday, July 25, and continuing through



All of the SCAMP slots have been filled.

Director Walt Davis proudly noted that nearly 20 adult teachers, assistants, and volunteers—led by Artistic Director Kim Nolen Wheelock and Floor Manager Angela Roberts—will guide the children through an arts rotation featuring creative visual arts, musical instrument instruction, choir instruction, and movement and dance instruction. Check-in starts at 8:30 a.m. on Monday. Children will be picked-up at 12:30 p.m. each dayfollowing lunch.

Synod of the Sun Presbyterian Women's Gathering

In addition to Dr. Rigby, attendees will attend two large workshop sessions and as many as four smaller sessions during the multi-day event.

She married Robert Leland Bidwell on June 6, 1953 and he preceded her in death August 17, 1977. She later married Ralph William Goodwin on March 22, 1980

and he preceded her in death on November 15, 2008.

In addition to her devoted and loving husbands, she was preceded in death by her parents, six sisters and three brothers. She is survived by her two sons, Robert M. Bidwell and wife Rosa and David M. Bidwell; five grandchildren, Joshua, Lara, Jordan, Gabriela and Xavier.
