Cook for a Day, Eat for a Week & Save Money, Too!

—Class Rescheduled for Aug. 26—

The date for the second of two free food classes offered by C-CAP, AgriLife Extension Service, and the Commerce Community Garden Project of the First United Methodist Church of Commerce has been changed. Originally, the cooking class on meal preparation was set for Aug. 5. That date has been cancelled and a new date of Aug. 26 is now scheduled, giving attendees plenty of time to sign up for the class at FUMC.

Time is an important topic of that class, which will be held from 9 a.m. to noon. That's because the course is aimed at saving time and money when it comes to food preparation. Attendees will get hands on experience in preparing food for a whole week ahead. Spending just a few hours in the kitchen can thus save you more hours during the week as you enjoy prepared ahead of time meals. The course will also provide tips on how to save at the grocery store using this prepare ahead of time plan.

You will want to sign-up fast because the class size will be limited due to space and its hands-on focus. All materials will be provided. A sign-up sheet is on the FPC bulletin boards in the hall next to the




For Being Awesome!
