How Did You Get to FPC?

Bart and Nancy Green were living 1n Marietta, a suburb of Atlanta, Ga, in 1981 right before they came to this area. The move was prompted by a phone call the Greens received concerning Bart's great-aunt, Juanita Green

Juanita was living on a farm in Cumby when she died at age 90, having outlived all her siblings.

Since the Greens' marriage, Nancy and Bart (thanks to Nancy) had exchanged Christmas cards with his great-aunt. The connection stuck and resulted in Bart's inheritance of the Green family farm. Thus, in 1981, Bart and Nancy and their two sons, four-year-old Ryan and one-year-old Carson, moved to Cumby.

The rest, as they say, is history.

Partial Solar Eclipse Coming to North Texas on Monday, Aug. 21


A total solar eclipse (when the moon crosses in front of the sun) will be visible on Monday in much of the United States. Here in North Texas, the eclipse will be a partial one, starting at around 11 a.m. and hitting its maximum coverage shortly after 1 p.m. starting to wane until it is finished just after 3 p.m.

The Bible lists many instances that have occurred or will occur in which the sun's light is taken away. It is not up to us to say if eclipses are involved. God, however, was and is in control, as always.

Warning: Do Not Temp Fate by Viewing Monday's Solar Eclipse without Proper Eye Protection

However, LIVESCIENCE senior writer Tia Ghose has written the following in an article titled "The 8 Most Famous Solar Elipses in History."

"The Christian gospels say that the sky was darkened for hours after the crucifixion of <u>Jesus</u>, which historians viewed either as a miracle or a portent of dark times to come. Later historians used astronomy to pinpoint the death of Christ based on this eclipse mention. Some historians tie the crucifixion to a <u>total solar eclipse</u> lasting 1 minute and 59 seconds that occurred in the year 29 C.E.; others say a second total eclipse, blocking the sun for 4 minutes and 6 seconds, in 33 C.E., marked Jesus' death.




