

Dear FPC family and friends,







Several PW events are scheduled in the next few weeks and all women are invited to participate in them.



Did You Know? Designated Gifts Help FPC

There are several opportunities available at First Presbyterian Church for designated gifts. At times, members make charitable contributions because they have been blessed, or as a memorial for someone they love or respect.

There are four designated funds designed for gifts to the church. They are: **Choir**, **Scholarship**, **Technology for the Sanctuary**, and **SCAMP**. Each is a worthwhile mission for the church.

The **Choir Fund** helps support the director, members, and University students. New music and care for the organs, and pianos can come from this fund.

The Scholarship Fund is through the University, and the Session directs the money to members of the church or to students attending the church.

The **Technology for the Sanctuary Fund** would help provide screens and more to update our sanctuary. It is a new fund which already has attracted a donation, and is viewed as an adjunct to the bulletin for use in worship, at funerals and weddings, and for Bible study.

The **SCAMP Fund** is used to support and grow SCAMP, an important mission that seeks to engage the children of the town in Christian music and art projects.

Pastor Krista and I hope this information will be helpful to the members in the coming years as they try to further the success of this church through designated giving.
