In a page one story in its Oct. 23 edition, The Commerce Journal's Caleb Slinkard pinned (and penned) down a date for the completion of the road in front of FPC. He wrote that Commerce City Manager Marc Clayton said the completion date for the completion of paving of the northern section of Monroe Street is March, 2015. That will allow the go-ahead for a planned ceremony to honor the World War II hero whose childhood home is located just doors down from FPC—Lt. General Claire Chennault.
