People will receive a tag for their bags (shown at right) that says "Blessed to be a blessing" on one side and on the other side is a blank for you to write your name,




followed by the words "is loved and prayed for by First Presbyterian Church of Commerce, Texas."

**FPC's Toni Deaton and Bettina Zvanut** attended a "Topping Out" Celebration at Fort Worth's St. Stephen Presbytery Church on Aug. 27. The 2 p.m. celebration marked the completion of repairs from a violent vandalism and fire that occurred last January.

The education building, which houses St. Stephen's pre-school program, Sunday School, and other facilities, was extensively damaged by a person who broke into their facility and remained there six hours wreaking mayhem. Along with much other damage, windows were broken and an attempt was even made to start a fire in the kitchen. St. Stephen, located near the Texas

# Harvey Facts—taken from CNN and other sources

- The Category 4 hurricane had a diameter of 280 miles with winds of 130 mph during its first landfall. After going back to the Gulf of Mexico, Tropical Storm Harvey went ashore again near the Louisiana-Texas border.
- Final totals are are still being tallied, but Harvey broke the continental U.S. record for rainfall from a single storm. By Sunday, it had dumped an estimated 11 trillion gallons of rain over the state, enough according to one television newscaster, to fill Lake Lewisville five times. The rate of rainfall was tremendous. The coastal cities of Beaumont and Port Arthur received 26 inches of rain in 24 hours. According to the National Weather Service, 49.2 inches of rain fell from midnight Aug. 25 to 9 a.m. Aug. 29.
- So far 41 deaths have been attributed to Hurricane Harvey, but the total is rising. Many thousands of people have suffered losses ranging from minimal to devastating. Property damage could potentially reach as high as \$190 billion, which would make it the costliest natural disaster in U.S. history.
