improvements for the Commerce downtown area and the area near the University which could make our community more visually appealing.

He showed slides of drawings of the proposed changes/improvements that would make our city safer for



both CISD and University students.

Two proposals that received the most comments were the "roundabouts" that could be engineered at the intersection of Culver and Hwy 50/24 and at the intersection of Hwy 50/24 and Live Oak Street. There was further discussion of the proposed bicycle paths and the reduced traffic lanes on Culver Street.

Everyone enjoyed learning more about the proposals, and a lively "Q and A" session followed the presentation. City Council member Gene Lockhart was also in attendance.
