Hurricane Matthew Leaves Devastation, Death in its Wake

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) urges your support for those affected by Hurricane

Matthew. The category 4 hurricane has been blamed for hundreds of deaths and millions of dollars in damage following its path from southwestern Haiti, eastern Cuba, and the east coast of the United States.toward the southeastern US coast. PDA was already active



in the area, doing long-term recovery work related to the 2010 earthquake in Haiti and Superstorm Sandy of 2012.

PDA is working alongside established partners to respond to this latest crisis, providing essential food, water, and supplies for impacted communities and villages in its immediate response. As long-term recovery needs are determined, PDA will continue to support those in impacted areas to help ensure a comprehensive recovery.

PDA is continuing to update storm-related recovery needs and information to keep the church apprised on the emerging disaster response.

Chamber's 'Halloween on the Square' Provides a Safe Place to Trick or Treat


It wasn't that long ago that Trick or Treating on Halloween was problematical for many parents of young children. If you want a safe way to have the Halloween fun of



FISH Working to Brighten Holidays with Dinners

During last year's distribution of holiday dinner boxes, Hunt County Shared Ministries (FISH) was in desperate need of turkeys. They were some 600 short to fulfill their anticipated needs. Fortunately, the need was publicized and the public came through.

This year FISH reports that it is in much better shape when it comes to turkeys. However, a spokesperson for the group said when contacted that it always helps to have the public's support.

If you would like to help FISH with a turkey or a donation, you can visit its office at 2815 King Street in Greenville or call 903-455-0545 to find out how you can make a difference.

Oct. 27 is the last of several dates for meeting FISH requirements for its holiday food boxes. Clients of the Commerce Food Pantry who meet the criteria are being signed up now. The Thanksgiving food box distribution date is one day only—Saturday morning, Nov. 19, while the Christmas distribution date is Saturday morning on Dec. 17.



Income for the nine months through September totaled \$95,643.57. This is 8.11% below the budget for nine months of the year. Expenses for the nine months through September were \$101,808.43. This is 2.19% below our budgeted expenses.

Year-to-date expenses have exceeded income by \$6164.86. The budgeted income and expense for each month is \$11,564.92.

September saw some very large once-a-year expenses, for example insurance, which ran the month's expenses up to \$15,936.87 against receipts of just \$8,538.39.

In summary, we have cut our expenses slightly at this point, but we are currently over budget thanks to some one time big ticket expense items.
