One of the things I did recently was reread all the notes written to FPCC placed on the bulletin board in the hallway in the fellowship hall.



I wanted to update everyone with the recent big life event! I can say it is the second best decision of my life after accepting Jesus, and that is marrying Jacob Clodfelter.


