


There is still plenty to participate in at the church and with you church family, as well as many opportunities to serve your community. Don't forget to come to worship!

Artist Walt Davis at The Nave Museum

FPC's **Walt Davis** has his own art show in Victoria, Texas, at the Nave Museum, which opened Nov. 18 and will close Jan. 7, 2017 Forty-four of his works are on display. For more information about the museum and the exhibit go to <u>navemuseum.com</u>.

There are 44 works in the show. They range in size from 3 X 5 inches to 3 X 5 feet. The three largest paintings are displayed as tapestries without frames.

Subject matter varies from traditional landscapes and architectural pieces to over-sized insect portraits and acrylic collage abstracts. Four are pencil drawings that became illustrations for the book, *Exploring the Edges of Texas*, co-authored by **Walt and Isabel Davis** and published by Texas A&M University Press in 2010.


"It has been wonderful to see 40 years of work gathered together in one place at one time. Several paintings were borrowed back from their owners, and one I had not seen for at least 20 years," said Walt. "I could not help but wonder what would have happened if my mother and an uncle, both gifted artists, had had the same opportunities to pursue their passion as I was afforded."

Some of his paintings can be seen on the museum website, as well as a long press release, which details biographical and other information about the artist. We've taken the liberty of lifting the following (not necessarily word for word) from that press release:

Walt is a signature member and past president of the Southwestern Watercolor Society. His work has been accepted into exhibitions of the American Watercolor Society, Southwestern Watercolor Society, Texas Watercolor Society, Richardson Civic Art Society, Greenville Art League, and Western Federation of Watercolor Societies. His painting, Katy-did, Katy-didn't, won the Margery Soroka Memorial Award in the 2013 American Watercolor Society competition in New York and was included in the Society's traveling show.

Note: The Nave Museum is located at 306 W.

Commercial in Victoria, TX and is open to the public 12-6 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 12-4 p.m. on weekends. The Nave Museum is closed on Mondays and between exhibits. Admission is Pay What You Want, and donation-based.
