A Message From the Pastor

Dear FPCC & friends,

The church season of Advent starts this Sunday, Dec. 2. and goes till Christmas Eve. Advent is the time before Christmas day that we prepare our hearts, souls, and minds for what it means to have Christ come into our



world. Each Sunday in Advent, that we focus on a word. Those words are 'Hope', 'Peace', 'Joy', and 'Love'.

Because I am constantly thinking about worship planning and content for my sermons I start thinking about and planning for Advent about the time the stores start putting out their Christmas items. You know how when you start to think about something then you see it everywhere? That has been happening to me.

Sometimes I will see random things that remind me of Advent. For example, I noticed the other day driving through downtown Greenville, a new mural on the side of a building

that said 'hope'. It made me wonder about all the other times that these four words (hope, peace, joy and love) come up in the mundane moments of our everyday lives.




Thinking about and living out our Christian

Baby Caps Project



Books Recommended in Horizons

In the November/December 2018 issue of Horizons, the magazine for Presbyterian Women, the "Pages Worth Turning" section, page 48, recommends several books.

One is a children's book entitled *The World Jesus Knew: A Curious Kid's Guide to Life in the First*


Century by Marc Olson published in 2017. Although the book is written for curious children, the book is also an enjoyable read for curious adults. In this book, Olson thoughtfully explores life in Jesus' time and place in a compelling narrative that also includes diagrams, charts,



maps, and drawings by Jem Maybank. This book will help children (and adults) better understand Jesus and his teachings. A wide range of topics is explored including how people dressed, Roman rules and burial practices. The book is highly recommended for all ages.

Another recommended book is *A Lens of Love: Reading the Bible in Its World for Our World* by Jonathan L. Walton, published in 2018. Horizons magazine says that Walton provides a meaningful way to examine scripture through the lens of God's

love. A quote from Laura S. Nasrallah, professor of



New Testament and theology, Harvard Divinity School, says this book "Sets a model for how to do biblical theology right---how to live faithfully toward justice. It shows how to bring practical theology and social ethics together and inspires its readers to live out a just and faithful Christian identity."


