#### A Message from the Pastor

Going into February we are continuing to focus on 1 Corinthians. It just so happens that the verses for this Sunday are well known as I will preach on 1 Corinthians 13:1-13. These are the verses that state what love is and isn't. For example, "Love is patient, love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude."



These verses are used extensively in weddings and they seem quite relevant as we head into the month that includes Valentine's Day. As some of you may know, Paul wasn't talking about romantic love or marriages when he wrote these words. Instead he is writing about a love that is grounded in God, a love for one another as brothers and sisters in Christ, the family of God.

Just as anyone can tell you how hard marriage is, or how hard staying in relationship with someone is after there has been some type of divide or breach of trust, Paul is saying love in and of the people of the Christian church is also hard. As humans we make mistakes; we mess up even as we strive to love like Paul describes. It just isn't possible.

Sometimes we get hurt and sometimes we hurt others, whether intentionally or not. This happens because there are things in this world that try to distract us from what truly matters. Paul says here that it doesn't matter who you are, what you have, or what you do, if you do not act with and in love it means nothing. Yet again, this is not acting with a superficial, romantic love, but a tough love. It is a love that was and is first given to us before we could say or do or choose anything. It is the love of God for us.

Although we may mess up love, love for others, and even love of ourselves, and never quite get it right, God's love is perfect and whole and is not based on anything we can say, do, or be, but it is based on who we are as God created us in the first place, and that is good. God sees the whole person, inside

#### Make the Knot, Too

As a follow-up and a continuation of its efforts to provide adult mentors to young students at Commerce Middle School, the Commerce Community Action Program (C-CAP) is launching "Tie the Knot, Too." This past year, its initial effort, "Tie the Knot" was aimed at getting adult men to mentor male students by initially teaching them to tie a tie.

The "Tie the Knot, Too" effort now underway, is similar in its approach—getting adult women to mentor female students by teaching the female students how to tie a scarf. Volunteers are being sought to make a three-hour commitment.

An informational meeting will kick things off with an orientation and the assignment of students. This meeting will take place on Wednesday, Feb. 6, at 4:30 p.m. in the Commerce Middle School Library.

A week later, on Feb. 13, adults and students will get together for a meet and greet and scarf tying practice. Then two weeks later, on Feb. 27, a lunch and new scarf presentation to students will be held.

By introducing mentors into the lives of the students, C-CAP hopes to build a stronger sense of community in Commerce. If you would like to be a part of this effort, come to the CMS Library and take the first step.

and out, before, through and past time.

As Paul says, what we see in the mirror is not the whole truth. Looking in a mirror we may judge ourselves in ways that society does but God does not, and we should strive to do and be the same. I will leave you with a conversation that I had with my daughter (who was 6 yrs old at the time). Sometimes the pure and simple wisdom of a child can help us understand what we ourselves make complicated.

With tears in her eyes, she said to me one day, "Wishes don't come true, mommy. Wishes



don't come true because everything I wish for never comes true. Like you and daddy not getting back together."

After a conversation about how wishes are kind of like prayers and sometimes they don't turn out the way we want them or expect them to, she replied, "Well one wish has come true. Love. Love came true the day I was born. No that's not right. Love came true before time."

No words have ever held more truth. Love. Love has always been here, is here with us now and always will be. We can trust in love. And there is no greater thing than love. So this month (and always), believe in love, act in love, show love, be loved, because that is what you are—a beloved, gifted, child of God.
