Leader: Because these plants turn bright and lively in the cold, short days of winter, we see in our own native land echoes of a Christmas miracle.

People: We place these blooming plants in the chancel to remind ourselves that Christ brings life to a suffering world, and we ask God's blessing on them and on ourselves.

BLESSING OF THE EVERGREENS Isaiah 60:13

Leader: Because the needles of pine and fir appear not to die each season, the ancients saw them as signs of things that last forever.

People: We hang these evergreens to signify the everlasting reign of Christ, and we ask God's blessing on them and on ourselves.

BLESSING OF THE CHRISMON TREE

Leader: Here in this place, we prepare for the coming of the Lord, and here we rekindle our prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus," as we await his coming as the bright morning star.

People: We hang these signs of Christ – lights, stars, and symbols of our King – to remind us of his identity and his story, as we ask God's blessing on them and on ourselves.

BLESSING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES & WREATH (John 1:1-5)

Leader: Like the prophets of old, we await the promised salvation of the Lord, and we look for the Light to shine again in the darkness.

People: We place these lights in this holy space as a witness to the light of Christ present with the faithful in every time and every place, and we ask God's blessing upon them and on ourselves.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES (Beatty Family)

Leader In this season of Advent, we are here to watch and wait and pray for the coming of light into the world. We long for the day when the things of darkness – selfishness and greed, suffering and oppression – shall be no more. Today we light the first candle of Advent—the sign of God's hope.

People: A candle burns, the sign of our hope. God of hope, come to us again this Advent. May your hope live within us, burning as a light in our lives.

Leader: Lord, by your presence, light up the past, that we might learn from it with thankfulness. Light up the present, that might live in it with love. Light up the future, that we might prepare for it in hope.

People: As we watch and wait and pray this Advent season, may we always be ready to encounter the Lord who is already and always with us. Amen.
