#### A Message From the Pastor

Am I wrong or did we just celebrate Christmas? I'm kidding. We did just celebrate Christmas. I know because our secretary, Roger, told me he still has not taken down his Christmas tree.



Since then, we've begun a new year, with all those New Year's resolutions

attached. I promise, I won't ask how those are going.

We've professed our love on Valentine's Day, and now, so quickly it seems, Lent arrives this month. What is Lent—the preparation time for Easter.

We kick off Lent this month with our Ash Wednesday service on Wednesday, Mar. 6, at p.m. Once again, I will draw the mark of the cross with ashes on the foreheads of those who come down the aisle as the solemn service nears an end. The imposition of ashes is to remind the receiver to repent, because we are made from dust and to dust we shall return.

Ashes are symbolic of grief, mortality, and repentance. In the Book of Job, Job has questioned God's authority and judgment. But he has a change of heart and declares to God that he repents "in dust and ashes."

And so, Lent gives us an opportunity to recognize that without God we are lost. We use this time to reflect on our lives and our relationship with God and, as we do so, realize that we are not as close as we need to be. No matter how close to God we may think we are, there is a gap. It may be small or it may be yawning chasm. Lent is a time to lose our pride and come humbly, full of repentance, back to God.

How you do that is very personal. Giving up something for Lent is a common practice, but too often "giving up candy" for Lent is not very helpful. Denying yourself is one way to focus more on God, but too often it isn't very permanent. It is too easy to think "just three more weeks to go." That's why Lent comes every year.



What is more helpful, I think, is to find a way to keep God close and in your life every day. The Lenten devotional book that we are using this year provides one way to do just that. It encourages a move from denial of some gratification we overindulge in to the adoption of a new spiritual discipline—divine seeing.

The beauty and majesty of God is all around us. The discipline of slowing down, taking in that beauty, and contemplating it seems to me to be a good tool to stay close to God, not just during Lent, but every day of our lives.

Maybe you have great ears. The sounds of God's presence are all around us, too. Whatever sense we use for our concentration, if we are serious in visualizing God's authority in the world and over our lives, I'm betting that the purpose of Lent—to get closer to God—will be fulfilled.


#### **Stephen Ministry Introductory Workshops**
