Easter is this month (April 16th) and I wanted to share with you part of the poem by Ann Weems called "The Church Year". Easter is my





Quilts for Flooring

Dr. James Norwood has donated five quilts to the Presbyterian Women of FPC to sell in order to replace the flooring in the Fellowship Hall and straighten the carpets in the Parlor and Nursery.All of the quilts were constructed in the 1940's. They seem to be hand pieced with machine quilting.

1. The first quilt is called "Grandmother Fan". The backing is a gold colored material It was made by Jim's grandmother and he recalls carding the cotton for the stuffing in Burleson, Texas. His grandmother's name was **Gertrude Gully**.

All of the rest of the quilts were constructed by Jim's mother-in-law in Silver City, New Mexico. Many in the church will recall Jim's wife, Ann, whose mother's name was Myrtle Barlow.

2. The first quilt she made was "Grandmother's Flower Garden". This quilt has a scalloped edge with fancy cutting using flower patterns. The backing is unbleached muslin.

3. The second quilt she created was called "Grandmother's Pride" which has a backing covered with another flower pattern.

4. "Michigan Pontiac Star" is the name of the

third quilt's pattern and has a light blue backing.

5. The last quilt has no known pattern. Mrs. Barlow may have made an original composition. It is a type of string quilt and was hand pieced. The backing is a deep blue material.

Carol Dodd and Isabel Davis inspected the quilts and gave me the information on the patterns and how they were made.

First Presbyterian's PW will make a decision about how the quilts will be auctioned in the next few months.

The brochures are on the table outside the FPC kitchen.



Our budget for 2017 is \$11,729 of operating expense per month. February receipts were \$11,865.59, including one unusual non-recurring deposit. These receipts were 1% higher than the budget.

Expenses were \$11,274.12. These expenses were almost 4% lower than the budget. The amount of receipts minus expenses increased our bank balance by \$591.47 in February.
