Commerce's Food Pantries Work Together to Introduce New Senior Program

Just about everything changes over time. The Commerce Food Pantry, especially lately, has undergone positive changes that mean more and better food choices for those it helps.

One very recent change has been the addition of a new 19-cubic foot commercial freezer which recently arrived (see the previous edition of *The Good News*) and is now being used to add frozen meats to the Commerce Food Pantry's expanding list of food choices. Another exciting recent change is a cooperative effort between the Commerce Food Pantry and the Church of the Nazarene's Bread of Life Food Pantry to introduce a new food program for senior citizens who qualify.

Being able to offer this program is possible because of another change at the Commerce Food Pantry, its acceptance as a member of the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB). Initially, NTFB membership gave the food pantry the ability to buy food in bulk at low prices to restock the food it provides. to those in need. It also provided a wider variety of fruits and vegetables than the pantry was able to obtain before membership.

The new program for qualified seniors (60+) is called the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) and is a service of the NTFB in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Texas Department of Agriculture. It is also sometimes referred to as PAN, which stands for People and Nutrition. The program provides one box of approximately 30 pounds USDA commodities per month to those enrolled.

Here's how the program works. The Commerce Food Pantry takes applications at First Presbyterian Church each Thursday from 2 pm to 4 pm. To enroll in the program a senior must provide (1) Proof of age (Birth certificate, TX ID or driver's license); (2) Proof of residency (Utility bill, rent receipt, or recent correspondence) and (3) Proof of Income (Social Security award letter(SSI/SSDI), check stub, or pension.)

The Bread of Life Food Pantry at the Church of the Nazarene, 301 Hwy 224, Commerce, distributes the free CSFP food package once a month on the Friday after the first Wednesday of the month from 10 am to 12 noon. The next distribution days are May 4 and June 8. For more information, send an email to <u>commercefoodpantry@gmail.com</u> and don't forget to check out the Commerce Food Pantry Facebook page.

Some other positive changes at the Commerce Food Pantry.

We've mentioned recent changes that have improved the ability of the pantry to help those that have food needs. Some other changes have been in place for a longer time—changes that haven't received the proper recognition that they deserve.

Two of these older changes have been an increase in the donations of fresh eggs and a new source of bread. They have come solely through the generosity of giving people. A variety of donors have made eggs in important part of the food pantry's offerings. The other welcome addition is the sharing of Panera Bread by the **New Life Congregational Methodist Church**, located at 911 Jernigan Street in Commerce. Thanks to these donors as well has each of the individuals, groups, and organizations who continually echo the work of Jesus in faithfully helping the food pantry feed the hungry.
