
The hymn title, the name of the person honored and the donor's name will be written in the bulletin to be used during the worship service.

• PW Circle Meeting

PW Circle will meet for Bible Study on Monday, May 8, at 10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. **Nila McQuary** will lead the final lesson of the study **Who** *Is Jesus* as we explore a contemporary interpretation of a familiar story in Matthew's Gospel through the eyes of a woman whose cultural context may differ from that of many of us. All women are invited to hear Nila's presentation.

The 2017 Birthday Offering, which celebrates Presbyterian women's history of mission giving, will be collected at the Circle meeting. This offering was launched in 1922 to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Women's Auxiliary in the Presbyterian Church in the United States. Since that time it has become an annual tradition and has funded nearly 100 major mission projects that continue to make a difference in the lives of women and children.

This year three projects have been selected to receive donations to the 2017 Birthday Offering:

- The Family Justice Center in Georgetown and Horry Counties in South Carolina, which is a Safe Haven for Victims of Domestic Violence. This Center can only house 11 people and is frequently at capacity. Our PW Birthday Offering grant will assist FJC in achieving its goal of constructing a new domestic violence shelter for victims of abuse living in these two counties of northeastern South Carolina.
- •Navajo Water Project in New Mexico, which will eventually provide water systems to 205 families at the Smith Lake Navajo Reservation in New Mexico. This Birthday Offering grant will provide a running water system for 40 families that do not have access to running water in their homes. The grant will provide each household with a cistern, pump, sink, shower and all pipes for the installation of their water system.
- First Hand Aid in Cuba. First Hand Aid Rural Clinic Development Initiative exists to diminish the suffering of the most marginalized Cuban citizens by providing them hope, dignity and the basic necessities of life and health. The Rural Clinic

Development Initiative is designed to establish six medical clinics in partnership with, and located at, Presbyterian Churches in rural Cuba that will provide medicine and care not available, or difficult to get, from Cuban sources in those communities.

• PW Missions

Craft Supplies for St. Stephen PC – Ft. Worth

Those attending the two Spring Meetings of PW in Grace Presbytery were asked to bring craft items for the Day Care and School Programs at St. Stephen PC-Fort Worth. You may recall that St. Stephen's education building, including the classroom and kitchen areas, was severely damaged by vandalism in January of this year. The suggested items included pipe cleaners, feathers, "googly eyes", and other glue-on decorations. The mission offerings received at both FPC-Granbury and Preston Hollow-Dallas will be given to St. Stephen for their school programs as well.

Synod of the Sun PDA Project

Several of our local PW members participated in a recent Synod of the Sun special project. Requested articles for PDA (Presbyterian Disaster Assistance) school kits were donated. Items collected were pencils, erasers, scissors, rulers and composition booklets. These items were taken to the Presbytery Mission Center in Dallas in March by Toni who attended the Synod of the Sun PW Coordinating Team meeting. From there the items were taken to the PDA headquarters in Arkansas by a member of the CT who lives near the PDA headquarters.

Local Mission Activities

◆<u>Baby Caps</u> – Three hundred fleece baby caps have been sewn by our PW this year and taken to the Hunt Regional Medical Center newborn nursery. Thanks to all who have participated in tracing, cutting out, and sewing these caps.

◆ Food Pantry – Members of PW bring canned goods for the pantry to every Circle Meeting and many work "behind the scenes" and help when the pantry is open.

◆**Bargain Box** – Several women donate their time each week at the downtown Bargain Box which does a brisk business in providing inexpensive gently used items for those who shop there.

• New Mission Project: Sole Hope

On Sunday, May 21st at 6 p.m., all church members are invited to be involved in a multi-generational mission called **Sole Hope**. Using patterns, we will be cutting out "parts" that will be used in making simple, but effective, shoes for children and adults

who live in Uganda, AFRICA. Denim from old blue jeans and parts of plastic milk or water jugs will be repurposed



for the shoes. FPC's growing collection of denim and The parts plastic jugs for Sole Hope is located just outside the kitchen.

The parts we cut out will be

clipped together and sent to the location where they will be constructed. From there they will be sent on to Uganda. The aim of Sole Hope is to allow children and adults to live healthy lives and be free of footrelated diseases through education, jobs, and medical relief. Jiggers is a parasite, a sand flea, that enters the feet of children and adults who do not wear shoes because they have no shoes. The result is painful and debilitating.
